
Yard Maintenance Tips

T'S ALWAYS

It is time to get started on the annual fall cleanup. The green carts make yard waste disposal pretty easy if you keep a few things in mind:

- Always fill your green cart first. Once it is full, use paper yard waste bags and make sure the tops of the bags are rolled closed. Yard waste in plastic bags will not be collected.
- Tie extra branches into bundles with natural fibre string. Branches must be less than 6 inches in diameter and 4 feet in length. Place branch bundles and paper yard waste bags at least 1 foot to the side of the green cart.
- During the busy yard season, the green carts will always be emptied but the pickup of extra yard waste bags may be limited. If your bags did not get picked up, please store them on your property until the next week's collection.
- There is a weight limit of 60 kg for green carts, and 20 kg for paper yard waste bags. If you can easily roll your cart and easily pick up your bag, they should be okay.
- From **September 28 to October 28**, you can drop off extra yard waste at City of Calgary landfills for FREE. Only yard waste like leaves, branches, plants and grass clippings is free. Sod, food waste or other garbage is subject to the standard garbage rates.
- The Spyhill and East Calgary landfills chip larger branches into mulch. You can pick up mulch free of charge but you are responsible for loading the mulch into your own vehicle.

South Crosstown BRT Update

The installation of the bus shelters along the new South Crosstown route is nearly complete and the BRT will start running this fall with service every 25 minutes. Buses will travel faster than other traffic along the route by way of traffic signals that provide an extended green light when buses are approaching, and by transit-only queue jumps that allow buses to get ahead of other traffic at signalized intersections.

You may have noticed that the new shelters along 18th Street incorporate public art on the shelter glass. The artworks are from the City of Calgary Public Art Collection and are meant to celebrate the depth and breadth of this important legacy. It has also been shown in other jurisdictions that the use of images to visually enhance the waiting area reduces the amount of vandalism and resulting operating costs.

The City is planning to rebrand the BRT service as "Max Routes" to differentiate it from other routes and highlight the enhanced service on the Max lines. Each of the three new lines will be given a different colour, and each route will have a bus custom-painted in its colour to promote awareness of the service. The South Crosstown route servicing Quarry Park will be branded as the Max Teal line.

- NO JOINING FEE IN SEPTEMBER


If you purchase a membership <u>by September 30</u>, the YMCA will waive the \$75 onetime joining fee.
